ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Class Schedule: Marquette students attend courses on a hybrid block schedule. This unique schedule is a combination of standard (45 minute) classes and block (91 minute) classes as well as periodic Academic Lab times. Students are enrolled in 7 class periods where ½ credit is earned per semester for each class. Academic Lab is conducted during the school day, typically twice a week, and students have the opportunity to receive tutoring, touch base with teachers, make up missed work or assessments, attend club meetings, and/or choose from a variety of offered activities including college rep visits. Academic Lab is designed for students to have choice in how to best achieve academic success and enrichment.

Advanced Placement: Marquette offers multiple courses through the College Board Advanced Placement program. There is no restriction to the number of AP courses students can take, however there are prerequisites for many that must be met before enrolling in an AP course. Marquette offers the 33 AP Exams in the following subject areas: World Language, Science, Social Studies, Math, Language Arts, and Fine Arts.

Dual Enrollment: Eligible and approved students may take college-level courses through local community colleges and universities during the regular school day. These courses typically will NOT appear on the high school transcript since they do not usually apply toward a student's high school graduation requirements.

Alternative Credit Opportunities: Rockwood students can also elect to apply for alternative credit opportunities such as ECP (Early College Program), South Technical School (½ day programming) or Spark! (immersion-based, community partnership).

College Credit/Dual Credit: Some courses are offered with the option for students to register to receive credit from a university with whom the Rockwood School District has an articulation agreement. College credits will NOT appear on the high school transcript.

Grade Point Average Calculation (GPA): GPA is based on grades earned in grades 9-12. **We do not report class rank.** All courses for which a student receives a grade are included in the GPA. GPA is based on a 4.0 scale with an "A" worth 4 points. For weighted grade classes, an "A" is worth 5 points. Weighted grades are offered in various Honors, some Engineering, and in all AP classes. **Honors Courses:** Certain courses are distinguished as Honors due to the nature of instruction but grades in Honors courses are not necessarily weighted.

COVID 19 UPDATES

2021-2022: Rockwood School District returned to operating on a semester, in-person instruction model with limited virtual course offerings.

2020-2021: The school year began on August 24th, 2020 in a virtual setting. For the 1st semester, classes were split into quarters with 1st, 3rd, 5th, and 7th hour classes occurring during 1st Quarter (8/24-10/23) and 2nd, 4th, and 6th hour classes occurring during 2nd Quarter (10/27-1/14). For the 2nd Semester, students had the option to choose in-person or virtual learning. Rockwood followed a block schedule for 2nd semester classes, and students were enrolled in 7 classes for the entire semester.

2019-2020: On March 23, 2020, the Rockwood School District began an Alternative Learning Plan (virtual instruction) which ran through the end of the school year. The district adopted a Hold Harmless approach - grades were not lowered from where they were recorded as of March 12, 2020, the last day before Spring Break. Student grades could improve, however, through submission of the ALP assigned work and assessments. In addition, final exams were not given during the spring semester.
